

Uptown Wireless Guest Access

Uptown Wireless – is the preferred wireless network choice for visitors while on the University of Cincinnati campus. The Uptown Wireless is a service provided by Cincinnati Bell in partnership with the University of Cincinnati. Registration and access to the Uptown Wireless is quick and easy.

* If you are a Cincinnati Bell ZoomTown customer you can gain access to the network using your ZoomTown username and password and there is no charge to use the service.

* If you are not a ZoomTown customer, there is no charge for an initial three-day connection, and although a credit card is used for authentication, you will not be charged for the first three-days of network use. If you do exceed the initial three-day complimentary connection period, the cost is \$1 per 24 hours of access, which is well below market compared to other Wi-Fi “pay as you go” services.

UPTOWN WIRELESS REGISTRATION AND ACCESS INSTRUCTIONS

Please follow the steps below to gain guest wireless access to the Internet. These instructions are for a Windows laptop.

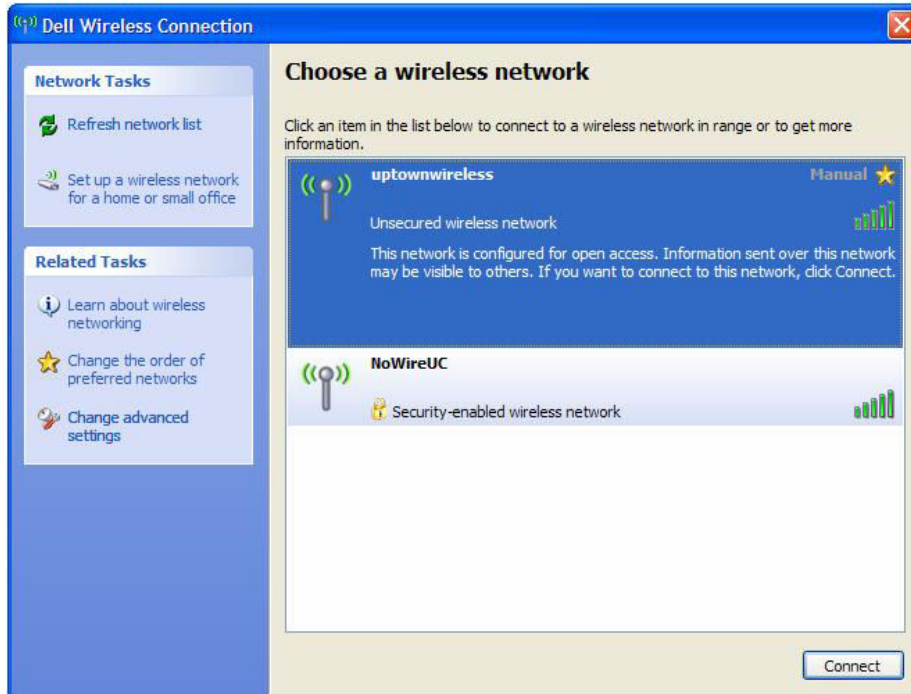
Locate the wireless network connection icon at the bottom right-hand corner of your desktop. Right mouse click the icon and you will see the box below. Select “View Available Wireless Networks.”

When the following box appears, select the wireless network labeled “uptownwireless” and click “Connect.”



When you have connected, open Internet Explorer and you will automatically be redirected to the Uptown Wireless registration page, see below. **Please disable your pop-up blocker at this time, prior to registering.** If pop-ups are not disabled you will not receive your password.

If you already have a Cincinnati Bell Zoomtown account you may LOG IN using those credentials; otherwise, click the blue “Click here” under “Get WiFi” and follow the instructions to register.
