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The Eighteenth Annual Meeting, open to Association members and nonmembers, welcomes persons from various disciplines and professions for discussion of common concerns in practical and professional ethics. Submissions are invited on ethical issues in various fields (e.g., public administration, law, the environment, accounting, engineering, computer science, research, business, medicine, journalism and the academy) and on issues that cut across professions. Special consideration will be given to topics that deal with ethical issues which cut across at least two disciplines or professions and are co-authored by persons from different disciplines. Teaching demonstrations, discussion of moral education, and presentations on ethics curriculum development are welcome.

Competition for Best Paper on Pre-college Ethics

The Association for Practical and Professional Ethics is pleased to announce that, with support of the Squire Family Foundation, we will sponsor a competition at the next Annual Meeting to advance the work of those interested in pre-college ethics. The Squire Family Foundation Award and a check for \$1000 will be presented at the Annual Meeting for the best paper submitted on pre-college ethics. Papers may address

issues of pedagogy, such as those that describe the advancement of a pre-college ethics curriculum; extracurricular activities such as ethics clubs, essay contests, and ethics bowls; school-based ethics centers; or collaboration with post-secondary ethics centers and the community. Analytic and research papers are eligible. The Squire Family Foundation will also provide support to invite a distinguished ethicist to address the issue at the Annual Meeting.

Annual Meeting Paper Competition for Graduate Students and Untenured Faculty

The Association is pleased to announce a competition for the best paper submitted by a graduate student for next year's Annual Meeting and a second competition for the best paper submitted by an untenured faculty member. Each winner will receive a \$500 award. To be considered, papers must be submitted following the regular process for paper submission and the author must check the appropriate box indicating graduate student or untenured faculty status on the registration form.

Undergraduate Paper Competition

Undergraduate students are invited to submit papers on any topic in practical and professional ethics. The papers will be reviewed, and the authors of the best papers will be invited to present their papers during a special concurrent session of the Annual Meeting. To submit a paper, students are asked to follow all guidelines for paper submissions for the Annual Meeting. The deadline for undergraduate papers is **October 30, 2008**. **Be sure to indicate on the Submission and Registration Form that you are submitting a paper for the undergraduate competition and complete the audiovisual information.** *The Annual Meeting registration fee will be paid for those students whose papers have been accepted.*

Media Ethics Division to Meet at the Annual Meeting

The Media Ethics Division of the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication will hold its mid-year meeting in conjunction with the Annual Meeting. The Media Ethics Division invites papers and panel proposals on all topics related to ethics in the media (journalism, public relations, advertising, entertainment media and the Internet). That includes submission of a completed Submission and Registration Form with the paper; papers will not be reviewed without a completed form. **Authors should indicate on the title page if they wish to be reviewed as part of the Media Ethics Division paper competition;** papers must be postmarked by **October 14, 2008**. Presenters of accepted papers and other Media Ethics division attendees at the Annual Meeting will be expected to register and pay registration fees at the regular announced rates for the Annual Meeting.

Mini Conference: Virtue and Business

Graduate Seminar on Teaching Practical and Professional Ethics

A special four-hour seminar on the teaching of ethics, open **only** to graduate students in all disciplines, will be offered during the Annual Meeting on Thursday, March 5, 2009. The seminar will be taught by **Richard Momeyer**, Miami University of Ohio. The seminar will focus on the problems, pitfalls and resources for teaching practical and professional ethics. Enrollment will be limited and on a first come basis. Participants need not register for the Annual Meeting to attend. There will be a \$25 registration fee for the seminar.

Fifteenth Intercollegiate Ethics BowlSM

Colleges and universities across the United States and throughout the world **who qualify in a regional bowl competition** are invited to enter teams of undergraduate students in the Associations' Fifteenth Intercollegiate Ethics BowlSM Competition. Attendance is open to Annual Meeting attendees and the general public. Individual students who compete may register for the Association's Annual Meeting for a special discounted fee of \$85. The Association will pay the registration fee for the first 70 actively competing students who wish to attend the Annual Meeting provided that they register by January 23, 2009.

Ethics Bowl is a team competition that combines the excitement and fun of a competitive game with an innovative approach to education in practical and professional ethics. The event is scheduled for Thursday, March 5, 2009. Competition will begin with preliminaries from 8:30 a.m. to 12:50 p.m., followed by quarter-finals and semi-finals from 6:00-8:45 p.m., and finals from 8:50-10:00 p.m.

Submission Guidelines

Submissions

You do not need to be a member of the Association to make a submission. You may submit materials in more than one category. All submissions must include:

- completed Submission and Registration Form for all authors and panelists, including audiovisual needs.
- three hard copies of submission with author's name(s) on a removable title page but nowhere else
- complete copy of 250-word abstract by e-mail sent to appe@indiana.edu

Your submission will not be considered for review until these items have been received.

Formal Papers

Please send three copies of your paper and three copies of a 250-word abstract to the Association, plus an abstract sent by e-mail (appe@indiana.edu), for review. Normally, previously published papers will not be accepted. To be considered, your submission must be the actual paper you intend to present – not an abstract and not a longer paper you intend to trim. Presentations are limited to 25 minutes. If you are proposing a panel, the completed Submission and Registration Form, including audiovisual needs, for all panelists must be submitted before the proposal will be considered.

Pedagogical Papers, Demonstrations or Curriculum Projects

Please send three copies of a 1-2 page description of your presentation. Include content and goals; format (e.g., demonstration of teaching materials, role play); target audience; and value of your presentation for teaching ethics.

Case Studies

Please do not submit cases unless you have permission from the copyright holder to use them for this meeting. Please send three copies of your case study or set of related cases (10 pages maximum) and a 1-2 page description of how the case can be used – what points it raises; what makes it interesting; disciplines, professions and settings to which it is relevant.

- Book submission deadline for Lunch with an Author is **October 10, 2008**.
- The postmark deadline for submissions is **October 20, 2008**.
- Undergraduate paper submission deadline is **October 30, 2008**.
- Presenters will be notified by **December 16, 2008**.

Lunch with an Author

Association members are invited to nominate their own books. Books must be related to the Association's interests and goals, and published within the last two years. Please submit three copies of a 1-2 page description of your book, and supply a copy of your book. Send a one-paragraph abstract by e-mail to appe@indiana.edu with no attachments. The deadline for submission of a book is **October 10, 2008**. Annual Meeting attendees will have the opportunity to sign up to attend Lunch with an Author with the author of their choice on Friday and/or Saturday. *Please note that authors pay for their own meals.*

Undergraduate Paper Submissions

Please follow the same guidelines for submission as for the Formal Papers. Be sure to indicate on the Submission and Registration Form that you are submitting a paper for the undergraduate competition. **Deadline for undergraduate paper submissions is October 30, 2008.**

Audiovisual

We require that you indicate your audiovisual needs on the Submission and Registration Form.

Registration Fees

Registration fees are *not required* with submissions, but are due **two weeks** after you have received notification of acceptance of your submission. Persons on the program are expected to pay the registration fee. The registration fee will be waived for full-time graduate and undergraduate students whose papers are formally reviewed and accepted for presentation. **On-Time registration ends January 24, 2009. Persons paying after January 24, 2009 will pay the late registration fee.** (Early Bird registration rates are available before November 26, 2008 for those already planning to attend the Annual Meeting.)
