Greater Cincinnati local governments are used to cooperating to find economies of scale to help lower costs and provide services as efficiently as possible. Hamilton County jurisdictions have been cooperating on services such as sewer, water, and health for some time. Even before these tough economic times, governments were looking for other ways to lower cost and increase quality of services.

The City of Silverton, is becoming a model for how "shared services" can keep cost down and help deliver better services. Mark Wendling, Silverton's City Manager, will highlight how the city's commitment to government efficiency has led to a joint fire district with the City of Deer Park, contracting building inspections with Hamilton County and joining a local government consortium that provides income tax collection service.

After Mark's remarks, you will participate in small group discussions to determine how all local governments can learn from Silverton's experience and work to be more efficient.
