She is also a Faculty Affiliate in the Department of Sociology and the School of Planning. She has published on gender, development, globalization, and sexual politics in the Americas, with an emphasis on gendered forms of resistance to neoliberal governance and modernity.

Faranak Miraftab is an Associate Professor Urban and Regional Planning at the University Illinois. Her research interests concern social aspects of urban development. She is interested in how low-income groups, and women in particular, access housing and basic urban services.

Noel Sturgeon is Professor of Women's Studies at Washington State University. She is the author of *Environmentalism in Popular Culture: Gender, Sexuality, Race, and the Politics of the Natural* and *Ecofeminist Natures: Race, Gender, Feminist Theory, and Political Action*.
