We will periodically remember our OLLI volunteers, moderators, and board members who have contributed to OLLI's success. The three following volunteers we honor died in 2014.

Peggy Bridgeland was a kindergarten teacher who said if you gave a

cookie to a child he willingly came to school. She founded and organized the cookie table to welcome participants at UC Blue Ash. She alone made and froze thousands of cookies each quarter for years. She was happy to share her recipes. She was also an active member of the Curriculum Committee.

We lost **Dr. James Englert**, a retired pediatrician, who became a moderator to share his love of roses and how to grow them. He grew about three hundred roses in his Kenwood home garden.

Tim Langner was a former OLLI board member and chair of the Finance and Friends Committees. According to Linda Brink, the OLLI videos featuring Sam Hollingsworth and Rosemary Deitzer were totally Tim's inspiration. She believes he thought of this concept as his gift to OLLI, and Linda felt privileged to assist in making Tim's dream a reality.



We received word last week of the death of **Saul Marmor**. Saul was the 2014 Unsung Hero Award recipient, former Board member, former chair of Special Events Committee, WOW Committee member, Marketing Committee member, and moderator of numerous courses throughout the years. Saul himself put into words what OLLI meant to him: "I love thee OLLI for opening up a world of talented moderators who kept me wanting more and more. I love thee OLLI because I was fortunate to have made lasting friendships with so many people. I love thee OLLI for bringing together the hundreds of other people who wanted the same thing I did . . . to never stop learning."
