### A Message from Karen Zaugg, Chair of the OLLI Board of Trustees

Because your OLLI Board of Trustees is a working board in every sense, you'll see Board members at welcome tables, orientations, AV carts, and more. These hardworking folks also engage in typical board activities. This spring, your OLLI Board is preparing the budget for 2016–17, updating bylaws, identifying new board members, and determining award recipients. Guidelines from our Strategic Plan cite a goal of 3 percent more revenue than expenditure in the budget, and we are striving to reach that mark with no rate increases in spite of expenses around the opening of the Victory Parkway Campus.

A key source of revenue is enrollment, which has been level this past year. The way most new members learn about OLLI is through word of mouth, so talk us up to your friends. It's wonderful to tell people where you find fun, intellectual stimulation, and like-minded friends in the community. Share with others the joys of learning with OLLI.

## We Remember

OLLI lost a friend on April 18. "Dr. Bob" Hasl was a moderator, former board member and former Curriculum Committee chair, who was involved with OLLI from his retirement in 2000 until his death.



- Carol Friel remembers, "Bob was unfailingly cheerful and kind—full of information about opera, ballet, and other cultural activities in Cincinnati."
- From his friend Bob Togneri: "He had an excellent bio, but it does not capture the man . . . enthusiasm, infectious smile and laugh that engulfed everyone he

knew, and love of . . . well everything and everyone! While Dr. Bob had many interests, his love of the Cincinnati Opera, I feel at least, was his baby.”

- Dick Goetz: “I met Bob in Charles Parsons’ opera class. We became friends based on our mutual love of opera. Seven years ago, Bob gave me two tickets to Dayton Opera that he couldn’t use. This prompted me to ask Carol Owens, whom I had met at Parsons’ Christmas party, for our first date to see *Elixir of Love* on Valentine’s Day. Six months later we married. We consider Bob and Charles as godfathers of our marriage.”
- Joe Hirschhorn: “He took over as moderator of the Let’s Eat Out course and brought in different speakers and guests to the program. He was also on the spot, physically, at many of the restaurants around town, enjoying a meal in the company of his wife, Suzanne. He will be missed.”
- Candace Stacey: “I can close my eyes now and see Bob clasping his hands, eyes gleaming with excitement, describing his and Suzanne’s latest dining adventure to his Let’s Eat Out class. Bob was such a passionate, kindhearted person that when he spoke to you he would make you feel like you were the most important person in the room. It’s a safe bet, St. Peter got both a kiss and a copy of Danny Meyer’s *Setting the Table* as Bob made his grand entrance through the pearly gates.”

One of our popular moderators, Bruce Martin, has passed. He was the moderator of I Love a Mystery from 1999 until 2013.



- Sally Moore remembers, “My husband worked in the office next to Bruce at P&G. We all belonged to a dance club; they were wonderful dancers. He had a loyal following for his course.”
- Rosemary Deitzer recalls, “I worked for Bruce when I was a secretary at P&G. His wife, Phyllis, was the first person to hire me right out of high school. We had dinner with them several years ago and recalled P&G and his time as an OLLI moderator.”
- Barbara Burke was a regular in his class and recalls, “He was a kind, beloved, gentle man. He came to class well-prepared about the mystery and also the structure of crime fighting. We made sure we got into his class because we loved it.”
