We Remember: Jeanne Crandell

Our beloved Jeanne Crandell died on April 24 but will remain in our hearts forever. She developed and created the Wednesday WOW series. She was instrumental in asking the Sycamore Senior Center to host our weekly programs. Jeanne was the recipient of the Aaron Levine Award, OLLI's highest honor. We volunteer for OLLI because we have the privilege of working with people like Jeanne. We are honored to continue her work. The WOW Committee members share

their thoughts of Jeanne:

Janet Banks: "As the creator of the WOWs, Jeanne was truly the heart and soul of OLLI. She loved and respected all that OLLI was to the folks who came before and those who would come after her. She was a wonder woman."

John Cozad: "She worked tirelessly and endlessly for OLLI. It would not be as good as it is without her long-lasting commitment and love for the essence of lifelong learning. She had enormous commitment to the students."

Carolyn Nightingale: "Jeanne was modest about creating Wednesday WOWs. She didn't seek acclaim: she only continued to serve and to offer positive support and to demonstrate welcoming receptivity to a 'newcomer's' different ideas and

programs”

Linda Brink: “The first time I met Jeanne was at the Cincinnati Symphony rehearsal for OLLI. At this event, she asked me to assume the responsibility for coordinating the rehearsals. Jeanne told me she had some other responsibilities she needed to address. At the time, I did not know she was reducing her commitments because she was ill. I was so influenced by Jeanne’s demeanor that I gladly accepted the task.”

Marv Heller: “I greatly respected Jeanne. When I was an OLLI newbie, I remember being impressed with her. She had an aura which let you know that she was confident in what she was doing, and there was nothing to be concerned about. The words that come to mind when I think of Jeanne are dignity, grace and style. She personified those and much more.”

Rosemary Deitzer: “The word ‘lady’ and Jeanne Crandell are the same word. The dictionary should define ‘lady’ as Jeanne Crandell. She is a beautiful woman inside and out. One of my first memories of joining OLLI (ILR) was going to one of her WOWs at the Union Institute in Clifton. She has wowed me ever since.”
