Our relationship with the Université de Bordeaux began in 2014 and has quickly evolved to the type of partnership we hope to achieve with all our strategic partners; one that cuts across all disciplines and through the academy from administrators to faculty to staff and students. They are enthusiastic, responsive, and inclusive – an ideal model for future collaborations.

Altogether, 69 students and 11 faculty have visited Bordeaux for academic purposes this year, engaging in collaborative activities from joint teaching, to student and faculty exchange, new dual masters' programs, and faculty-led, short-term student mobility.

EUROPE

Specifically:

- 12 UBx faculty have visited UC under our faculty exchange program in disciplines including philosophy, psychology, chemistry, English, engineering, business, anthropology, and medicine. UBx has hosted 9 UC faculty in similar areas.
- UC Prof. Bill Connick and UBx Prof. Jean Louis Bobet have developed a joint curriculum to engage cohorts of French and American students with a research project outcome. This year, our chemistry program led 15 UC students to Bordeaux to meet and work alongside their French partners.
- Prof. Michèle Vialet is about to lead 8 students on her third French short-term study abroad
- UBx and UC engineering have entered into a one-year master's in Aero-Systems Operations to begin this fall. Together, they will have a joint booth at the Paris Air Show to promote our dual degree program and research in aerospace.
