Important Information

- Required by ALL optometry schools.
- Scores range from 200 to 400 and are reported in increments of 10.
- Computer-Based Testing Exam offered year-round at Prometric Test Centers.
- \$510 fee (as of July 2022) Covers the cost of sending scores to optometry school added at the time of application. \$50 additional fee applies for each additional score report after application submitted.
- Average test score for accepted students is 331 (somewhere around 300 is acceptable) nationwide and <u>OSU</u>
 Optometry average is 339.
- Unofficial test score report and explanation received immediately upon completion of OAT. No other score
 report will be sent to the examinee. Official scores will be released to schools approximately three weeks
 after the test date. Schools of optometry require official score reports for decision-making.
- Applicants who have three or more OAT attempts must apply for permission to test again. From that point forward, they may retest only once per 12-month period.
