Important Information

- Required by most pharmacy schools.
- Computer-Based Testing <u>Test dates</u> in July, September, October, January, and February, March, April. Test will be taken at a Pearson VUE Test Center and you can schedule your seat after submitting your online registration.
- \$210 fee Covers the cost of sending scores to 3 pharmacy schools. Additional \$20 fee for score reports beyond 3.
- Read the <u>PCAT Candidate Information Booklet</u> thoroughly.
- For most schools you need to designate PharmCAS for your score. Confirm your selected school uses PharmCAS.
- During the test, you can request that your test not be scored. This means no scores will be reported to you or any schools. This request is irrevocable.
- If there is evidence of irregular guessing on the exam, the exam score may be invalidated. Examinees are encouraged NOT to randomly fill in bubbles on unanswered questions.
- Unofficial preliminary score report given at the end of the test. Official score reports are released within 5 weeks.
