**CONSTITUTION**

---

Article I. Name and Objective

(a) Name:

The Association shall be known as the University of Cincinnati Association of Administrators, Managers, and Professionals, and by the abbreviation, UCAAMP.

(b) Mission:

The mission of the Association shall be:

- to serve its members through an integrated communications system that addresses work-related needs and concerns
- to provide members with professional development opportunities
- to provide a network of colleagues

supporting the overall mission of the University of Cincinnati.

(c) Operating Principles:

The operating principles of the Association shall be:

- to operate in such a way as to benefit the University of Cincinnati and Association members
- to value differences and respect one another
- to maintain professionalism
- to focus on the work-related needs and desires of the entire membership
- to promote the involvement of members in the Association.

Article II. Membership

The membership of the Association shall consist of active employees, retirees, and honorary members, as provided in the Bylaws.

Article III. Officers

The officers of the Association shall be a President, a President-Elect, a President Emeritus, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, Membership Coordinator and a Communications Coordinator. The President-Elect shall be elected annually for a term of one year and shall ascend successively to the offices of President and President Emeritus, serving one year in each position. The Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and Editor shall be elected for terms of two years.

Article IV. Executive Board

There shall be an Executive Board of the Association consisting of the Association's officers and six elected members as provided in the Bylaws.

Article V. Eligibility to Hold Office

Eligibility to serve as an Officer or Executive Board member of the Association shall be restricted to active members as defined in Chapter I, Article I of the Bylaws.

Article VI. Voting Rights

Voting rights for the election of Officers and Executive Board members, amendments to the Constitution and/or the Bylaws, or for any other issue presented to the membership for a vote shall be restricted to active members of the Association as defined in Chapter I, Article I of the Bylaws.

Article VII. Amendments

Every proposition to alter or amend this Constitution shall be submitted in writing by any member to the President who shall discuss the proposition at the next Board meeting. The proposition must be voted on by the Executive Board. If approved by the Board by a majority of votes cast, it shall then be submitted to the entire active membership for vote by mail ballot, in the same manner as in the balloting for officers as provided in the Bylaws.
