

Report from the CRSC Subcommittee for
CAS Sports Administration and Facilities and Hospitality Management Program Alignment

Subcommittee Charge: To recommend a single uptown college and department home for the College of Applied Science's Bachelor of Science in Sports Administration and Bachelor of Science in Facilities and Hospitality Management degrees to the CRSC by June 1, 2009.

Outcomes from the 5/19/09 meeting:

- Connie, representing the Business and Commerce Department of the College of Applied Science, suggested exploring a separately accredited technical department or school within the College of Business.
- Citing accreditation concerns, the College of Business (CoB) has no interest in serving as the academic home for the Sports Administration or Facilities and Hospitality Management programs or faculty. The Dean and Sr. Associate Dean of CoB will be visiting with the accreditation body on or about June 15th to discuss structural arrangements that would permit a separately accredited technical department or school within CoB to exist. Bill stated that there is very little chance that a scenario such as this would be acceptable to the accrediting body.
- The College of Education, Criminal Justice, and Human Service's Health Promotion & Education Department may be an academic home for the Sports Administration program and its faculty. Brad indicated that he would speak with Dean Johnson about this possibility.
- It was suggested that the Facilities and Hospitality Management program be modified to focus attention on the facilities component of the curriculum and then a possible affiliation with the Construction Management program within the New College could be explored.
