BIOS

Richard Canter is the Music Director of the Cincinnati Junior Youth Wind Ensemble and serves as band director for Walnut Hills High School in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he directs bands in grades 7-12, including the Marching Blue & Gold and the Wind Ensemble. Throughout his career as an educator, Mr. Canter has been an advocate for music education, serving four years as District President of the Ohio Music Education Association. He has a passion for helping students reach their highest goals in music. This passion led to the creation of the Scale & Rhythm Chunks program, a teaching tool that is used by bands throughout the United States and internationally. Scale & Rhythm Chunks is endorsed by Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser as "exactly what is wanted and needed...an idea whose time has come." Mr. Canter is sought after as a guest clinician and conductor throughout the region. He has presented sessions on band pedagogy throughout the United States, including two presentations at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, and music education conferences in 26 states. Mr. Canter's awards and honors include Educator of the Year, the Celebrate Excellence Award, and was a winner of the Music Educators National Conference Music Composition Competition. In 2022, he was inducted into the arts wing of the Ross High School Hall of Fame. Mr. Canter holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from Bowling Green State University and a Masters Degree in Music Education from Miami University. He resides in Cincinnati, Ohio with his wife, Kellie, and their two children, Lilv and Andrew.

Neal Clark, a native of Philpot, Kentucky, is a second-year graduate student at the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music where he is a Teaching Assistant within the Music Education Division. While completing his undergraduate degree, Clark performed in a variety of ensembles including marching band, wind ensemble, brass guintet, and tuba-euphonium ensemble. During the summers of 2012 and 2016, Clark marched contra with the Madison Scouts Drum and Bugle Corps. When not playing his tuba, he has played the drum set with a variety of collegiate jazz ensembles, jazz combos, and in his church. Clark has 3 years of teaching experience in Kentucky and Ohio, teaching PreK - 6th grade general music, high school jazz band, and a variety of marching band activities. He is currently the assistant director and conductor for the Junior Cincinnati Youth Wind Ensemble. Clark's jazz bands received distinguished ratings at festival. The 2019 Daviess County Indoor Winds, co-directed by Clark, were named Independent A World Champions, having competed against 35 ensembles from across the country and around the world. Clark currently writes marching band drill for multiple ensembles in the United States. During the 2018 and 2019 summers, Clark completed Level 1 and Level 2 Orff Schulwerk Training. He received a degree in music education from Murray State University. His primary teachers include Dr. Todd French, and Dr. Thomas Gamboa. Clark recently celebrated his first anniversary with his wife Lisa. They enjoy spending time together by the pool or on the ski slopes, going on trips with their newly purchased teardrop camper, and making music together. Lisa is also a music educator, currently teaching in northern Kentucky.
