

LILY CARMICHAEL CONDUCTING FELLOW

Lily Carmichael (she/her) is a choral conductor based in Philadelphia. She directs the choir at Congregation Kol Ami in Cherry Hill, NJ, and she serves as music director of the Bryn Mawr Renaissance Choir. She received her M.M. in Choral Conducting from Temple University and her B.A. in Music and Mathematics from Vassar College. Her research areas include health and wellness in the choral classroom, performance-related musculoskeletal disorders affecting singers and conductors, and ableism in music academicism.



MICHAEL DENOMME CONDUCTING FELLOW

Michael Denomme is a Canadian musician, educator and conductor originally hailing from North Bay, Ontario, and now calls Toronto home. Michael holds a Bachelor's Degree in music education from the University of Toronto, where he is also now half way through his masters Degree in Choral conducting, studying with Dr Jamie Hillman. He is the 2022-2023 recipient of the Elmer Isler national fellowship in Choral Conducting, Michael is currently the Associate conductor of Mississauga Children's choir, where he leads the junior choir, and continues to work as an assistant conductor with Toronto Children's Chorus, VIVA Youth Singers, and U of T's MacMillian Singers.



MAURO LEDESMA CONDUCTING FELLOW

Mauro Ledesma was born and lives in the city of San Miguel de Allende in Guanajuato, Mexico. A pianist by training, he is in much demand as a performing pianist, and a piano teacher. In recent years he has been working more with choirs and orchestras as a conductor, and has reached the point in his professional life where he wishes to improve his skills and broaden his training in the choral realm.



JOSH LISNER CONDUCTING FELLOW

Passion, Dedication, and Joy are the best ways to describe Josh Lisner and his musical journey. Lisner happily holds the title of Director of Choirs and Vocal Music at Edison High School. Under his leadership, students have performed challenging and diverse repertoire, have earned superior and Best-In-Class ratings, and have been acknowledged at internationally recognized venues such as David Geffen Hall at Lincoln Center. Lisner graduated Summa Cum Laude from Westminster Choir College, earning a degree in Music Education, and singing in Westminster Choir. He is a member of the Philadelphia Symphonic Choir under Yannick Nézet-Séguin and Joe Miller's direction.



MICHAEL MCCORMICK CONDUCTING FELLOW

Michael McCormick, conductor, currently serves as the Choral Program Associate at Princeton University, Music Director of Ars Musica Chorale in Ridgewood, NJ, and Music Director of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Basking Ridge, NJ. He graduated from Westminster Choir College with a B.M. in Music Education, and Rutgers University with an M.M. in Choral Conducting. As a chorister, Michael has sung with St. Bart's NYC, Trinity Church Princeton, Norfolk Chamber Choir, and the Philadelphia Symphonic Choir. As a soloist, he has recently sung works by Haydn, Honegger, and Nadia Boulanger with the Riverside Choral Society and Rutgers University Kirkpatrick Choir.



YUAN ZIQI CONDUCTING FELLOW

Yuan Zigi received a Bachelor's degree in Composition and Conducting from the Shanghai Conservatory of Music and is expected to receive her Master's degree in Conducting from the University of Music and Performing Arts Munich in Germany with Prof. Andreas Herrmann and Prof. Micheal Gläser.
