Leadership Positions

Dean, College of Liberal Arts, University of Mississippi (2015 - present)

As the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, I represent and lead the largest academic unit on campus with 18 departments and a budget of over \$60 million. The College offers four undergraduate degrees (i.e., Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science) across 37 majors and 55 minor fields of study. At the graduate level, we offer 19 master's programs and 11 doctoral programs. The College is home to nearly half of the University's faculty (approximately 300 tenured/tenure track faculty and 300 instructors/lecturers). In addition to housing the fine and performing arts, the natural sciences and mathematics, the humanities, and the social sciences, the College houses 14 interdisciplinary programs, 13 Centers/Institutes, and three ROTC units. The mission of the College of Liberal Arts is to provide the General Education component of all of the University of Mississippi's undergraduate degree programs, offer undergraduate and graduate degree programs in the liberal arts and sciences, extend the boundaries of research/scholarship within the fields represented by the college, actively participate in making the resources of the college useful to the general public, and shape the cultural life of the University of Mississippi.

Key achievements:

- Increased research expenditures by 58% between first and second terms in this role.
- Developed and implemented an aggressive plan to increase the number and quality of Ph.D. students across the programs in the college.
 - Observed an overall increase of approx. 25% in the number of doctoral students between the 2016-2017 and 2024-2025 academic years.
 - Ph.D. graduation rates have more than doubled between the 2017-2018 and 2024-2025 academic years.
- Created 8 new college-level awards that focus on research/scholarship/creative achievement, one pre-tenure and one post-tenure, across our 4 major discipline groupings. Seven of these 8 awards have been endowed by generous alumni gifts.
- Averaged approximately \$10M/year raised for the College via private gifts
 - These fundraising efforts have led to the establishment of Endowed Professorships, faculty support/awards, doctoral student stipends, undergraduate scholarships, and building/equipment improvements across the college.

- Enhanced support for access, opportunity, and strategic initiatives
 - Hired first Associate Dean for Access and Strategic Initiatives and a Program Manager dedicated to supporting this role.
 - Coordination & support of efforts to fund and enhance belonging among faculty and students including:
 - NSF ADVANCE Catalyst Award
 - Howard Hughes Medical Institute ie3
 - Multi-Year Faculty Cluster Hire Initiative
 - Creation of the James Meredith Changemaker Award
 - Honors an extraordinary graduating undergraduate who has made positive change in broadening access, participation and opportunities on campus.
- Increased focus on marketing, recruitment, and student success which has contributed to 4 consecutive years of growth.
 - Spring 2025 enrollment numbers in the College of Liberal Arts up 23.7% compared to Spring 2022 numbers.
 - Expanded student support services (academic counseling)
 - Established the College Student Ambassadors
 - Regular digital messages sent to admitted students
 - Strong support to student success programs (FASTrack, HPAO)
- Significant improvements to academic and research facilities
 - More than \$325M in new construction and renovations

Chair, Department of Psychological Sciences, Texas Tech University (2011 - 2015)

As the Chair of the Department of Psychological Sciences, I represented and lead one of the largest departments on campus, overseeing a budget of over \$4,000,000. During my time as chair, the Department of Psychological Sciences was home to 31 full-time faculty, 5 staff, approximately 110 doctoral students, and nearly 1,000 undergraduate majors. The department offered the Doctor of Philosophy in Clinical Psychology, Counseling Psychology, and Experimental Psychology (with emphases in Applied Cognitive Psychology, Human Factors Psychology, and Social Psychology) as well as a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology. The department strongly valued multicultural diversity, with approximately 27% of our doctoral students self-identifying as ethnic minorities.

Key achievements:

- Extramural funding credited to the department increased from \$69,910 - the year before I became chair (FY10) to \$838,302 the last year I served in this role (FY15).
- Between the 2010-2011 and 2014-2015 academic years, Student Credit Hours increased by a total of 17%
 - Graduate SCH increased by 26.2%
 - Undergraduate SCH increased by 15.9%
- Secured \$222,000 in additional scholarships and other financial support for graduate students.
 - Developed a model by which graduate students in the department were changed from 9-month stipends to 12-month stipends.
 - This model led to an increase in overall summer Graduate SCH by 47.8% during my time in this role (2011-2015)
- Hired 10 new tenure-track faculty members. I also worked with the Vice President for Research and the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in hiring an endowed professor.

- Increased the visibility of faculty via university-wide awards
 - During my tenure, faculty in the department were awarded 7 university wide research, service and teaching awards
 - To put in perspective, the department was awarded one such award the 11 years prior
- Secured approx. \$400,000 to renovate the Psychology Building and Psychology Clinic.
- Initiated a reorganization of the undergraduate curriculum.

Director of Clinical Training, Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology, Department of Psychology, Texas Tech University (2005 - 2010)

As the Director of Clinical Training, I represented and led a large, effective doctoral training program that is accredited by the major accrediting body for such doctoral programs in psychology, the American Psychological Association (APA). The program had approximately 40 doctoral students, who were recruited from all over the nation, and had outstanding academic records. The clinical program had 7 full-time faculty, within a psychology department of 28 full-time faculty positions (at the time). The program followed a “scientist-practitioner” training model, where we aspired to educate Ph.D.-level clinical psychologists who would become excellent researchers, clinicians, teachers, scholars, service providers, and professionals with strong ethics and integrity. The program became one of the most diverse doctoral programs on campus with over 30% of the students self-identifying as an ethnic minority.

Key achievements:

- Successfully navigated the program through APA reaccreditation
- Increased the diversity of the doctoral students admitted into the program
- Initiated a plan to recruit a more diverse faculty
- Worked with program faculty to enhance the evaluation procedure for our doctoral students
- Led a reorganization of the program’s curriculum
- Increased the presence of our students in community service settings

MAJOR RESEARCH INTERESTS

My research program systematically explores behavioral, cognitive, and physiological mechanisms that contribute to nicotine use, withdrawal and dependence. I am interested in identifying healthy alternative behaviors that may compliment current smoking cessation efforts but am also interested in examining relevant individual differences that may help to maintain tobacco use, including personality traits, emotional regulation, and affective states such as depression and anxiety. More recently, given the well-documented connection between drinking and smoking, I have become interested in examining ways in which to reduce problematic use of alcohol among college students as well as the relationship between smoking and drinking.

MAJOR TEACHING ACCOMPLISHMENTS & INTERESTS

While at Texas Tech University, I established myself as an effective instructor at the graduate and undergraduate level.
