




#### CSR Robbery Reports: Year-to-Date






#### CSR Auto Theft Reports: Year-to-Date



#### CSR Burglary Reports: Year-to-Date




#### Burglary / Breaking and Entering: Year-to-Date



# Training Highlights 2022

- In March, the department upgraded to the Taser 7 platform while training and certifying all officers on them.
- In the month of June, all officers went through Active Threat training at the Shriners building while it was vacant.
- In November, all officers went through Low-Level Light range training while using both the pistol and rifle platforms.
- During November and into December, all officers will go through Scenario-Based Training. This is a full day of scenarios that were designed to encompass ICAT, De-Escalation, Legal Authorities, and Use of Force. This is a new initiative in which the training does not accompany any classroom teaching so you see exactly how officers would react.

# Pedestrian Safety Incident on September 28,2022

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, a driver sped through a red light near campus at Jefferson and University Avenue, striking two of our students who were crossing at a marked crosswalk. One student was injured and the other was killed.

## Pedestrian Safety efforts include:

- High visibility patrols with UC police and security officers during rush hours near campus.
- Installation of speed <u>notification signs and trailers</u>.
- Digital Messaging Boards.
- Increased traffic enforcement by Cincinnati Police Department.
- We are also working closely with the City of Cincinnati on longer term solutions. Those efforts are being led by our Planning, Design & Construction team, which is meeting with Cincinnati Traffic Engineering to improve key intersections around campus.



# Active speed notification signs and trailers UCPD - Cincinnati Police - State Highway Patrol







