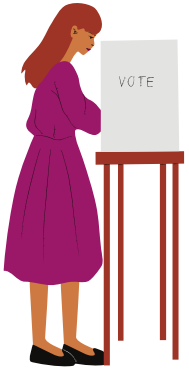


LINES AND VOTING



Citizens of the United States have a constitutional right to vote. This means that if you are standing in line and the polls close **you still have the right to vote.**

If the poll workers can't find your voting registration information make sure that the poll worker double checks lists and any available databases.



Also, make sure you confirm your polling location and that all your information is correct.

- If none of these steps fit you have the right to fill out a provisional ballot. That ballot will later be reviewed by election officials.**
