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What is College Credit Plus?

- The College Credit Plus (CCP) program has been established to enhance students' college and career readiness and postsecondary success by enabling college-ready, 7-12 grade students who qualify for college admission to take college-level courses for which they earn both high school and transcribed college credit upon successful completion of coursework.

Benefits of CCP

- Earn high school and college credits at the same time
- Get a “head start” on career planning and degree or certificate completion
- Experience college early to understand the expectations of college life
- Save tuition and textbook costs

Consequences of Underperforming

- Grades are permanently recorded on high school transcript and college transcript
- Grades calculated into high school GPA and may serve as entry college GPA
- Potential financial consequences if students do not earn a passing grade or if they withdraw too late from college courses (district may require students/families to reimburse the tuition that the district had paid)

High School vs. College

Being “college-ready” is more than just being academically ready

- Consider emotional and social transition and college expectations
- Courses on campus/online are taken right alongside regular college students
- Courses may include mature content (material of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature) and content will not be modified based on CCP students’ enrollment in the course.

High School vs. College

Being “college-ready” is more than just being academically ready

- Students must be able to self-advocate; parents/guardians provide support but student is in the “driver’s seat.”
- Consider time management, organizational skills and prioritization skills necessary to succeed in credit-bearing college coursework
- College courses tend to have less opportunities for graded work. Ex. Instructor may rely on a mid-term and final exam to determine grade in a course rather than many quizzes, homework opportunities, etc.

CCP Options at UC

- Take courses during the summer, fall, & spring semesters
- Take courses at your high school*, college campus, or online
- Cross enroll at any of UC's campuses
- Choose from a wide selection of courses

**courses offered in high school are with specific partner schools*

UC CCP Eligibility

ON CAMPUS/ONLINE CCP Eligibility for all UC Campuses

Meet one of the following criteria to be considered:

- 3.0 unweighted High School GPA
- 2.75-2.99 unweighted High School GPA and a
 - “B” grade or better in at least one high School English course and a
 - “B” grade or better in at least one high school math course
- ACT (18 ENGL/22 MATH) or SAT (480 EBRW/530 MATH)

UC CCP Eligibility

IN HIGH SCHOOL CCP Eligibility for Partner Schools

Meet one of the following criteria to be considered:

- 3.0 unweighted High School GPA
- 2.75-2.99 unweighted High School GPA and a
 - “B” grade or better in at least one relevant high school course
- ACT (18 ENGL/22 MATH) or SAT (480 EBRW/530 MATH)

- Summer Start: April 15, 2022
- Fall Start: June 1, 2022

Orientation, Advising, and Registration

On campus or online

- Once admitted to the program and prior to registration, the following steps are required:
 - Placement testing in English and/or Math (when applicable)
 - Virtual CCP Orientation
 - Virtual Academic Advising (one on one appointment)
 - Course Registration
 - registration for Summer begins late February
 - registration for Fall begins in July

UC CCP Placement Testing

- **UC Math Placement Test**
 - If student plans to enroll in:
 - Math or Statistics
 - Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Business
- **UC Self Guided English Assessment**
 - If student plans to enroll in the following subjects:
 - English

Course Eligibility Rules

Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses, which include:

- Transferable courses (OT36, TAG, CTAG)
- Courses in IT, Computer Science, Anatomy & Physiology, foreign language
- Courses that are part of a technical certificate
- Courses that are part of a 15- or 30-credit pathway
- Courses in study skills, academic or career success

Course Eligibility Rules

Non-allowable courses include:

- Private applied courses with one-on-one instruction (such as performing art lessons)
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- Pass/Fail graded courses
- Remedial courses or sectarian/religious courses

Enrollment Limits

- Public School Students may enroll in up to 30 credits per year, which includes high school courses:
$$30 - (\text{secondary school units} \times 3) = \text{max CCP credits}$$
- The maximum number of credits allowable for a student while participating in the program is 120 (Grade 7-12)
- Students who wish to take more than the allotted 30 hours may pay out of pocket for the tuition, fees and books associated with the course under “Option A” of CCP.

UC CCP Advantages

- The role of the UC CCP Academic Advisor is to provide advice and guidance appropriate to advance each individual student's education goals and plans.
- Individual academic advising sessions required each semester before a student's registration hold is lifted.
- Personal relationships fostered between academic advisors and students from initial semester entering our program through high school graduation and beyond.

- Free academic supports and tutoring

- Application fee waiver for former CCP students as first-time freshman applicants
