### Admission Criteria:

- Completion of the courses on this worksheet does not guarantee admission to the UC program.
- Students who complete the AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant at Sinclair Community College have satisfied the UC General Education requirement.
- A student must:
  - Hold an AAS degree from the Occupational Therapy Assistant at Sinclair Community College
  - Hold credentials as an occupational therapy assistant as certified by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy; conditional acceptance is granted into the program for those who are eligible to take the OTA exam and have a plan in place to complete the exam.
  - Complete a UC application (including submission of official transcripts from all institutions attended and payment of application fee).
  - Pay UC's matriculation fee.
- Students must be admitted to the UC College of Allied Health Sciences during the duration of this agreement.
- Minimum GPA: 2.50
