Option 1: An optional placement test

When taking the test, keep in mind the following:

1. You must use a UC email.
2. You can only take the test once.
3. At the end of the test, you will receive the scores. The score will help you to decide which class to take. However, you can still take a different class if wanted.

Have a look at this table to see which class you should take based on your score:

| Test Score | Class |
|--------------------------|-----------|
| 0-250 | SPAN 1001 |
| 0-125 | SPAN1011 |
| 126-250 | SPAN1012 |
| 251-369 | SPAN1002 |
| 251-310 | SPAN1013 |
| 311-369 | SPAN1014 |
| 370 (or more) | SPAN2015 |
| Coordinator's permission | SPAN2016 |

*** SPAN1011, 1012, 1013, 1014 are not offered on Main Campus.

Option 2: Self-guided placement form

The self-guided placement test will provide you with some questions and information to help you decide what's the best class for you. At the end of the form, you will be asked:

“Look at the topics covered in each course, your own experience with the language and your own course schedule. In which Spanish course do you think you will be most successful?”

- If your answer matches with the class in which you will be more successful according to the language coordinator, then you can go ahead and enroll in that class. In that case, the language coordinator will not get in touch with you (unless you email him personally).

- If the language coordinator think you may benefit from taking a different class, he will get in touch with you to recommend moving to a different section. However, you will be able to decide which class to take.
