June, July, August	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Sign up for and review <a href="#">LSAC Law Hub Admissions Unmasked on Demand</a> to build foundation for understanding the process</li> </ul>
September/October/November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Familiarize yourself with LSAT format and questions through <a href="#">LSAC Law Hub Free Resources</a></li> <li>❖ Register for and attend <a href="#">Law School Application and Personal Statement Writing Workshop</a></li> <li>❖ Set your score range goal through research: <a href="#">ABA 509 Standard Disclosure</a>, <a href="#">LSAC Law School Search Tool</a></li> </ul>
December/January/February	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Take free full length, timed diagnostic test</li> <li>❖ Research test prep options and make decision</li> <li>❖ Create test prep schedule to include 12-15 hours week; include when you will take full length practice tests</li> <li>❖ Attend <a href="#">Law School Application and Personal Statement Writing Workshop</a> if you haven't done so already</li> </ul>
March	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Begin test prep; 12-15 hours per week, stay committed to schedule</li> <li>❖ <a href="#">Register for June LSAT</a> – Cost is \$222</li> <li>❖ “Plant the seed” for letters of recommendation</li> </ul>
April/May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Continue Prep; 12-15 hours per week; include full length practice exams</li> <li>❖ <b>Deadline to register for June test is early – mid April</b></li> <li>❖ Begin draft of Personal Statement</li> </ul>
June	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Take final practice test               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ If score is not in goal range, <b>meet with PPAC advisor and reassess</b>. Consider retake in August or September and strategize for stronger score.</li> <li>▪ If score is within goal range, sit for test; complete Writing portion within one week; receive score by end of June.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
July	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Pay for (\$200) and begin completing <a href="#">LSAC Credential Assembly Service</a></li> <li>❖ Request transcripts from every institution where you earned college credit</li> <li>❖ Meet with PPAC advisor to review personal statement draft</li> </ul>
August	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Continue to work on personal statement draft and meet with PPAC advisor</li> <li>❖ Make “final ask” for letters of recommendation and include letter writer contact information in Credential Assembly Service</li> <li>❖ <a href="#">Make final decision</a> on which schools you want to apply to</li> </ul>
September – November 15	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Complete and submit application to chosen schools</li> </ul>
December	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ End of the calendar year is the absolute latest you should submit applications</li> </ul>
January	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Complete FAFSA</li> </ul>
